## COMMUNITY UPDATE – ENTRY TO APY LANDS

25 February 2022

The Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara Executive Board of Management met this week to review entry requirements to the APY Lands in light of the serious threat COVID-19 continues to pose to vulnerable communities.

The Board resolved to maintain restrictions that allow entry only to essential services workers. However, the APY Permits team will consider all requests on a case-by-case basis.

The following entry requirements remain:

- Anyone arriving into Australia from any international destination since 25 October 2021 is not permitted to enter the APY Lands
- You must be fully vaccinated with two doses. Strictly No Jab, No Entry. Evidence of your vaccination status must be from myGov
- APY Permit application form or notification if applicable
- National Police Check or Working with Children Check
- APY Individual or Organisation Risk Assessment form
- APY Health Record form 72 hours before entering the APY Lands
- Evidence of a Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) negative COVID-19 test result 72 hours before entry to the APY Lands. The PCR test must be undertaken from your departure location from an approved Health Provider as part of a permit application to enter the APY Lands. If you are testing for this reason, you do not need to isolate until you receive your test result.
- Everyone must wear a mask for 7 days in all public spaces on the APY Lands after entry
- APY Permits will assess applications with all the relevant required documentation within 10 to 14 days. Please remember that APY is a small team with a large area of land to supervise. Be patient.

If you have tested positive to COVID-19 you cannot enter the APY Lands for 10 days unless you have been cleared to do so by a COVID GP Assessment Team doctor where you have been under their care; or you have been cleared by a COVID hospital medical team if hospitalised. A clearance certificate/letter is required to be sent to APY Permits.

You must get tested if you:

- have COVID-19 symptoms, even if they are mild
- are a close contact of someone who has COVID-19
- have been directed by SA Health or SAPOL.
